(c) to (e) The pay structures of the IIT faculty has historically been higher than many other institutions which has been maintained in the 6th Central Pay Commission (6th CPC). The pay structure has been so designed as to attract faculty and retain good teachers as faculty in IITs.

Central Universities

227. SHRI SANTOSH BAGRODIA: SHRI KALRAJ MISHRA:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the Central Universities approved by the Central Government, location-wise;
- (b) whether it is a fact that these institutions are functioning from the make-shift temporary campuses;
 - (c) if so, the reasons therefore; and
 - (d) the steps that are being taken to provide them with land?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI D. PURANDESWARI): (a) The Central Universities Act, 2009, which came into force on 15.1.2009, provided for the establishment of fifteen new Central Universities in the States of Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala. Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu and Uttarakhand, which included conversion of three *erstwhile* State Universities. Subsequently, the Central Universities (Amendment) Ordinance, 2009 was promulgated by the President on; 20.10.2009 for the establishment of one more Central University in the State of Jammu and Kashmir.

- (b) and (c) For each of the thirteen new Central Universities, the concerned State Government is to provide, free of cost, about 500 acres of land. The exact location of each University will, therefore, depend on the various sites as may be offered by the State Government, and would be notified by the Central Government in the Official Gazette. Pending selection of sites, allotment of land and development of their permanent campuses, most of these Universities have started their academic activities from temporary premises.
- (d) Based on the recommendations of the Site Selection Committee constituted by the Central Government, land sites for five Universities have already been finalised. The Site Selection Committee has visited the sites offered by the State Governments in respect of three more Universities and is in the process of visiting the sites for the remaining five Universities, which is expected to be completed shortly.
