VEERAPPA MOILY): (a) to (c) The existing procedure for appointment, transfer and posting of judges of Supreme Court and High Court is based on the Supreme Court Judgment of October 6, 1993 in the case of Supreme Court Advocates on Record and Anr. Vs. Union of India, and the Advisory Opinion of the Supreme Court dated October 28, 1998. The procedure has been criticized in various fora. There is no proposal at present before the Government to reconsider this procedure.
