

Increase in the prices of essential commodities

2237. SHRI KANHU CHARAN LENKA: Will the Minister of FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that there has been an increase in prices of food stuffs like rice, dal, edible oils, and kerosene oil in the country during the last years; and

(b) if so, what were the market prices of these commodities during 1987-88 and the percentage of increase in prices?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FOOD AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI D.L. BAITHA): (a) During 1987-88 there has been increase in the prices of various commodities mentioned in the question except Kerosene, the price of which has remained steady.

(b) The retail prices of 11 commodities in Delhi as on 27-3-1987 and 25-3-1988 are given in the enclosed Statement.
