- (a) what is the number of jute mills in West Bengal which, are under Lock-out;
- (b) what are the reasons therefor;
- (c) what step_s have been taken by Government to re-open those mills; and
- (d) what is the break-up of the number of workers involved mill-wise?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) and (b) According to Government of West Bengal, 13 jute mills employ ing 48,700 workers are urfder lock out. A major reason for lock-out, among others is surplus manning with unremurierative cost of production.

- (c) The State Labour Machinery has intervened and taken steps to resolve the disputes which are in various stages of conciliation.
- (d) A statement giving the number of workers in each of the mills affected is attached.
