DATT TIWARI): (a) One Indo-Senegal Joint Ven has been \_ fure set up ia Senegal by Government of India in collaboration with, the Government of Camroon, Ivory Coast, Nigeria and Sene gal. At present, there b no other propo sal of that kind pending for consideration.

- (b) The Joint Venture hag been set up in the field of manufacture of phosphoric acid and phosphatic fertilizers.
- (c) Main terms and conditions of the Indo-Senegal Joint venture are • (i) Total equity of the project shall be CFAF 32,23.38 million (ii) The equity share of Indian Consortium shall be CFAF 5876.02 million, (iii) The Indo-Senegal joint venture would make available to India' 1,10,000' tonnes of phosphoric acid (in terms of P2 05) per annual for a period of 15 years and (iv) Earnings by way of dividends etc. shall be repatriated to India in free foreign exchange.

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government have not yet announced the minimum support price for raw jute on statutory basis for 1988-89: and
  - (b) if so, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRI RAM NIWAS MIRDHA')"! (a)<sup>1</sup> and (b) Government have announced the minimum suppo'rt'price'of W-5 'grade' of jute in Assam for 1988-89 on ' 64-1988 the corresponding prices for different varieties and grades of jute' arid! mesta for various up-country markets have also been an nounced by the lute Commissioner on 17-4-1988. The statutory fixation of the minimum support prices has been done away with for the 1988-89 season. Apart from being ineffective, the statutory clause was leading to manipulation and malprac tices. However, the open-ended commit ment of the' jute Corporation of India to provide remmierative prices to' the farmers will continue in the next season also.

#### Fresh migrations from Punjab

- (c) What steps are contemplated 'by Government: for their' rehabilitation/early return to their respective homes?

THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI BUTA SINGH): (a) Deputy commissioned Delhi has reported that 591 families have migrated from Punjab during the period 1.1.1988 to 15-44988. No other State has reported migration during this period.

- (b) The Delhi Administration is providing the following relief to the genuine migrant families from Punjab;
- 1. Financial assistance for diet/food money @ Rs. 10/-per member/per day subject to a maximum of Rs. 1000/- per family/per month.
  - 2. Free semi-pucca tenements/tented accommodation.
    - 3. Free facilities of electricity, water etc.
  - 4. Provision for ration articles at control rates.
  - 5. Facilities for recreational activities such as library, TV set etc.
  - 6. Assistance in the admission of migrant children in schools.
- (c) The Government of Punjab provi des the following facilities to the return ing migrants:
  - (i) Ex-gratia grant of Rs. 5000/- to cover initial expenses on return to the State.
  - (ii) Transport grant of Rs. 2500/- to cover transport expenses on return to the State.
  - (iii) Facility of bank loan upto Rs. 25,000/- including a subsidy component of Rs. 5000|- to be paid by the State Government to enable the returning families to start income generating activity.
- (iv) Allotment of Low Income Group (LIG) house on concessional terms—at the place of resettlement of family or in the event of non-availability of LIG. house, grant of house rent allowance of Rs, 250|. per-month.

## Strategy to bring more people into the income-tax net
