and community health centres are likely to be achieved in full during the remaining two years of the 7th Plan. However, some shortfall is likely in respect of sub-centres.

(c) and (d) According to the State Government, the reason for shortfall is the non-availability of sufficient number of Auxilliary Nurse Midwives for being appointed as female health workers at sub-centres. The admission capacity of ANM training schools in the State is 2750 candidates per annum and the State Government have been advised to ensure full utilisation in order to train these functionaries in adequate numbers.

## Coaching centres in Universities/ Colleges for the minorities and SC and ST

## SHRI PRAMOD MAHAJAN:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RE-SOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to refer to the answer to Unstarred Question 2225 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 16th March, 1988 and state:

- (a) what are the names of the minority communities entitled to be benefited by the coaching classes for minority students organised in various Universities/colleges funded by the University Grants Commission;
- (b) the amount disbursed so far, university-wise, during the last two years and what are the guidelines for disbursement;
- (c) whether the coaching centres for the SC and ST for the same purpose are under the Ministry of Welfare and are exactly similar in all respects and if not how do those differ; and
- (d) what are the reasons for not having similar educational coaching

centres for the SC and ST in Universities and colleges under the Ministry of Human Resource Development?

THE MINISTER OF STATE INTHE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI L. P. SHAHI): (a) The UGC scheme for Coaching Classes for Competitive Examinations for Weaker Sections amongst Minority Communities is applicable to all minorities.

- (b) A list of universities and colleges to whom grants have been given by the UGC during 1986-87 and 1987-88 for organising the coaching centres under the scheme is given in the enclosed statement (See below). The first instalment of 75 per cent of the grant is released at the time of approval of their proposals and the remaining 25 per cent on submission of the progress report, expenditure statement evaluation report, atc., by the universities and colleges.
- (c) The broad objectives of the two schemes are similar although the target groups are different. The UGC scheme prepares persons belonging to weaker sections amongst minority communities to enable them to compete: (i) in various competitive examinations: (ii) for admission to professional courses; and for acquiring proficiency in typing, shorthand and secretarial courses. The scheme of the Ministry of Welfare prepares persons belonging to SC and ST candidates to enable them to compete in various competitive examinations and for acquiring proficiency in typing, shorthand etc. However, there are some differences in the apattern of financial assistance and modalities of implementation of the two schemes.
- (d) The "Gosching and Allied Scheme" for SC/ST administered by the Ministry of Welfare, inter alia provides for organising coaching classes through universities colleges or directly by the universities.
