Water supply for industrial sector

(a) whether it is a fact that the water supply problem, both in the urban and rural areas, is becoming more and more difficult year after year; if so, what are the details of the action plan Government have drawn up to ease the problem; and

(b) whether Government are considering to instal sewerage water recycling plants in urban areas with a view to augmenting the water supply so that at least the demand for water by the industrial sector is met; if so, what are the details in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF TEXTILES AND THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI RAM NIWAS MIRDHA); (a) and (b) Due to frequent drought conditions prevailing during the past few years, water supply problems have been experienced in many parts of the country. Drinking water and sewage schemes are framed and implemented by State Governments. Their efforts in this regard are supplemented by the Central. Government under the Centrally Sponsored Accelerated Rural Water Supply Programme and the Technology Mission on Drinking Water in Villages and Related Water Management.
