(a) whether the job capacity, quality of work, quantum of disposal of the officers and production in establishments have increased; after introduction of Saturday as weekly off; if so, in what way; if not, what is Government's reaction thereto;

(b) whether Government are aware of the fact that there is a wide spread discontent on the introduction of two weekly holidays;

(c) whether Government inquired before introducing two weekly holidays as to which are the developing countries including China, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Indonesia and Pakistan having two weekly holidays; and

(d) whether Government propose to restore the old practice of one weekly off?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SHRI BIREN SINGH): (a) While no formal assessment of the 5-day-week system has been made, a quick study made by the Dept. of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances in Feb., 1987 with reference to a few Ministries/Departments, did not indicate any fall in work output in terms of quantity or quality after introduction of the system.

The study did not go into the issue of increase in job capacity or production establishments.

(b) The 5-day week system was introduced in the Administrative offices in June, 1985 in consultation with the staff representatives under the Joint Consultative Machinery & Compulsory Arbitration There has so far been no complaint from any recognised Service association in this regard.
