THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. NATWAR SINGH): (a) Although the Prime Minister has been invited to visit China, and the invitation has been accepted in principle no dates have been fixed as yet.

(b) There has been an improvement in bilateral relations with China in the areas of culture, science and technology and trade since the official level dialogue between India and China began in 1981. Both India and China have stressed the need to maintain peace and tranquility on the border.

(c) 27 Chinese delegations visited India and 26 Indian delegations visited China during the period January 1987 to the present. These visits covered the following fields: Official-level discussions on bilateral relations, trade, textile, machinery, housing construction, radio and television, telecommunications, high earth rock dams, laser technology, plasma physics, instrumentation, education, wasteland development, mineral resources, publishing, electronics, agricultural development, the performing arts, adult and non formal education, childhood disability programmes and religion and philosophy.
