The allotment by the Centre of these commodities to StateslUTs is decided depending upon the stocks available with the Central Government, relative demands of various S'.'ates|UTs, past lifting, open market availability etc.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND COOPERATION IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI SHYAM LAL YADAV): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) It is the policy of National Dairy Development Board to issue imported butter to the user dairies primarily to ext&nd the supply of liquid milk. However, the allocation of imported butter for manufacture of table butter could be considered only after meeting the requirements of dairies for recombination purposes.
