SOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI MARGARET ALVA): (a) to (c) Govt, of India has introduced a scheme for laying of synthetic athletic tracks/artificial surfaces. envisages providing financial assistance @ 50 per cent of the estimated cost, subject to a maximum of Rs. 50 lakhs per track/surface to the State Governments, National Sports Fededra-tions/ Associations, etc. The balance amount is to be found by the State Government/User agency and an assurance of this given to the Central Government. Proposals have been invited from all State Governments. The State Govt, of Punjab has not yet sent any proposal under the scheme for laying of synthetic track at any of the places in Punjab.

However, the Central assistance released to Govt, of Punjab for development of sports and games i.e. creation of sports infrastructure under Central scheme of 'Grants to State Sports Councils etc' during the last three years is given below: —

Music training in schools

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRI L. P. SHAHI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Art Education is included as a significant area of child development

in the curriculum developed in light of National Policy of Education 1986. In the programme of "Community Singling" songs in different languages have been included. They have also been compiled in a book entitled 'Let's Sing Together'. Efforts have also been made to teach community singing to teachers and children so as to enable them to sing these songs not only in mother tongue but also in different languages and to develop a sense of national identity.

Construction of coastal road between Madras and Vishakhapatnam

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF SURFACE TRANSPORT (SHRI RAJESH PILOT): (a) and (b) Madras is already connected to Vishakhapatnam by an existing NH. No. 5 running close to east coast serving all the major towns, en-route. It is, therefore, not possible at this point-of time to render financial assistance for another parallel road in the coastal belt.
