RAJYA SABHA

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI TAPAN SIKDAR): (a) The Telephone lines on which Internet connections work are more in use for Internet traffic *vis-a-vis* the speech traffic.

(b) Yes, Sir. It is expected that as Internet connections increase, the traffic on the corresponding phone lines will increase.

(c) and (d) Incentives presently being extended for promoting use of Internet are:

- (i) Government is providing access to the nearest Internet Node on local call basis in all the District Headquarters of the country except Kargil and Poonch in J&K State.
- (ii) 20% concessions on rental for leased lines used for Internet access is being given by Government at present.
- (iii) Recognised Educational Institute/Government organisations/ Newspapers and News Agencies are presently being given 50% concession on port charges by Government. 100% Export Oriented Units (having annual export turn over above US \$ 1,00,000). Software exporters are also getting 20% concession on annual port charges.

It is proposed to open Internet Dhabas in all Block Headquarters of the country by March 2001.

Development of Communication and Information Technology Network
