THE MINISTER OF STATE IN !*HE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KRISHNA SAHI); (a) and (b) The ndian Institute of Advanced Study vas set up in 1965 as a residential :entre to provide an academic environment to scholars suitable for idvanced research in selected sub-ects in humanities, Indian culture, comparative religion, social sciences, latural sciences etc.

(c) Tbii mai_n function of the Institute is tti appoint Fellows fo_r undertaking research on different themes.

Since its establishment, the Institute appointed 154 visiting Fellows and 5 Core Fellows till the end of 1977, of whom 69 submitted complete manuscripts and 9 part manuscripts. In order to provide ; opportunities for interaction among scholars, the Institute organised 38 seminars on various topics from 1965 till the end of November, 1977. It brought out 21 volumes of the proceedings of the seminars, 35 volumes of the research work done by Fellows and H volumes of lectures delivered by the Visiting Professors.

Following the appointment of Review Committee in September, 1977 the academic activities of the Institute were kept suspense. Based on the recommendations of Krishna Kirpalani Committee, the Institute was reorganised in August 1984 in accordance with the scheme of reorganisation and restructuring of the programmes and activities of the Institute as approved by the Government. Since reorganisation, the In-stitue awarded 39 fellowships to scholars for undertaking advanced research. The Institute also organised 9 seminars on selected subjects of topical interest.
