THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI AJIT PANJA): (a) During 1987, the programme 'Chitramala' was cancelled only once viz. on 12-1-87.

(b) At present, there is no proposal to increase the frequency of this programme.

Raid against video piracy

2067. SHRI THOMAS KUTHIRA-VATTOM: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of raids coonducted all over the country against vide piracy and the number of cassettes confiscated as on date, State-wise number of raids and confiscation of such tapes;
- (b) the number of blue film cassettes confiscated as on date, statewise; and
- (c) what action Government have taken against the blue film shooting going on in various parts of the country?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI AJIT PANJA):
(a) and (b) As the enforcement of relevent statutes is the responsibility of the State Governments, Central Government do not maintain statistics relating to number of raids conducted against video piracy and the number of confiscated cassettes, including those of blue films.

(c) Production of films in India is in private sector and generally no permission from any Government is needed for shooting a film. However, all films before their public exhibition have to be certified by the Central Board of Film Certification as per the provisions of the Cinematograph Act, 1952 and the Cinematograph (Certification) Rules, 1983 and the guidelines issued thereunder by Central Government.

The guidelines inter alia provide that the Central Board of Film Certification while certifying a film for public exhibition will ensure that humansensibilities are not offended by vulgarity, obscenity and depravity.

Sending Indian astronaut in space

2068. SHRI THOMAS KUTHIRA-VATTOM: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state what progress has been made in sending an Indian astronaut into space in collaboration with USA?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECH-NOLOGY AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT, ENERGY, ELECTRONICS AND SPACE (SHRI K. R. NARAYANAN): Due to the unfortunate accident with Space Shuttle Challenged' in January 1986 and the consequent transfer of the launch of INSAT-IC to Ariane and INSAT-ID to Delta unmanned aunchings, the INSAT-IC Payload Specialist flight programme had to be dropped. Presently, the Space Transportation System (STS) flights are suspended and are not expected to resume until June 1988. Also, at present there are no Indian spaceraft slated for STS launchings. As and when the new NASA policy on light of foreign Payload Specialists on future STS flights emerges, the possibility of flying an Indian astronaut on STS in collaboration with USA NASA will be considered and a decision will be taken keeping in view the scientific technical and other benefits that many accrue from such a flight.

Definition of family

(a) whether there is any proposal for rationalising the definition of 'family' for the purpose of extending the family pension benefit to the mother of a bachelor Government employee;

Ex-gratia payment to CPF retirees
