THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. NATWAR SINGH): (a) The Chinese Government do not recognise the validity of the McMahon Line which constitutes the international boundary in the Eastern Sector. Due to differences in interpretation of the McMahon Line, it is possible for infringements to take place. These matters are under discussion with the Chinese Government and it is the policy of the Government of India to resolve problems through peaceful negotiations.
