

Failure to achieve power generation targets

3323. **SHRIMATI JAYANTHI NATARAJAN:** Will the Minister of **ENERGY** be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that fifteen electricity producers including the National Thermal Power Corporation failed to achieve their power generation targets for 1986-87; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof and what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF POWER IN THE

MINISTRY OF ENERGY (SHRIMATI SUSHILA ROHATGI): (a) and (b) The National Thermal Power Corporation (NTPC) exceeded its target for power generation in 1986-87. The organisations which did not achieve the target during 1986-87 along with details are indicated in the enclosed Statement. (See below).

The main reasons for the short-fall in thermal generation include forced outage of thermal units, long time taken in maintenance and major repairs, equipment deficiencies etc. The shortfall in hydro generation was mainly due to low reservoir levels.
