(b) In response to an appeal from the OAU India contributed 57,000 tonnes of foodgrains in 1985 to the OAU Special Emergency Assistance Fund for Drought and Famine in Africa.

(c) Government have been malting strenuous efforts in the United Nations, the Non-aligned Movement and the Commonwealth to press for effective international action to secure the dismantlement of apartheid and the establishment of a democratic polity in South Africa and the early acces-

sion of Namibia to independence. Through its Chairmanship of the Af- rica Fund Government are also engaged in efforts to mobilise world public opinion against the evil of partheid.

Complex at Khejarill, Jodhpur

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI Z. R. ANSARI): (a) to (c) The Department has received an outline of the proposal for setting up of a National Memorial at the village Khejarili, near Jodhpur from the Chief Conservator of Forests Rajasthan. The proposal relates to establishment of Environmental Awareness Centre having a museum, a library an open air auditoriufm, audio-visual aides. declaration of Vishnois belt (Jodhpur Tehsil) as a biosphere reserves; instittuion of a fellowship in Jodhpur University for the study of ecology of the region; establishment of Krishna Mrig (Black-Buck) Park at Khejarli. and creation

of 'Khejri' grove of trees at Khejarili with a nursery. The propsal is under consideration of the Department.

Appointment of Agents by States for Sending Labourers Abroad

3559. SHRI RAMS1NGHBHAI PA-TALIYABHAI RATHVAKOLI: Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that some States have not yet appointed Agents for sending labourers to foreign coun tries even though the Bill in this re gard has been passed;

- (d) what are the names of Agents! Agencies in Gujarat through whom the labourers are being sent abroad; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE *OT* THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI P. A. SANGMA): (a) to (c) Under the Emigration Act, 1983 it is not obligatory for the States to appoint Agents for manpower export. However, States of Andhra Pradesh, Ta-milnadu, Kerala, Maharasttra; Orissa- Uttar Pradesh; punjab and Union Territory of Delhi have set up State Manpower Corporations registered with the Ministry of Labour.

- (e) The agencies which are financially sound and trustworthy are given registration as per provisions of the Emigration Act, 1983.
