- (b) if so, which authority gave the permission for such clearance greenland against the declared policy of Government on ecology and environment:
- (c) whether the action of the NDMC amounts to ravaging the ecosystem there; and
- (d) if so, what action has been or is being taken against the NDMC?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI Z. R. SARI): (a) to (d) The details are being collected and will be placed on the Table of the House.

Construction of Helipad in Arunachal Pradesh by China

166 SHRI NAGEN SAIKIA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Chinese have constructed a helipad on the Indian-soil in Arunathal Pradesh;
- (b) if so, what steps are being taken to make them vacate the place;
- (c) whether it is also a fact that the Chinese have collected revenues from some parts of Arunachal desh; and

(d) if so, what measures are being taken by the Government in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. NATWAR SINGH); (a) The Chinese have improvised a helipad in WANGDUNG in the Sumdorong Chu valley of Tawang District of Arunachal Pradesh.

- (b) The issue of the Chinese intrusion in WANGDUNG has been taken up with the Chinese authorities and a strong protest lodged. It is our policy to strive for a peaceful settlement of the boundary question with China and to persevere to resolve disputes through peaceful negotiations.
- (c) According to information available with Government, no revenues have been paid by Indian citizens in Arunachal Pradesh to the authorities.
 - (d) Does not arise.

International Trade Fairs

167. SHRI SUNIL BASU RAY: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether there is any proposal to hold international trade fairs and other international fairs at centres other than Delhi;
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof; and
- (c) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI P. R. DAS MUNSHI): to (c) The Trade Fair Authority India is scheduled to organise an international leather fair at Madras during January-February, 1988. No concrete proposals have emerged for organising international fairs at other places, at present.
