

Irregular and inadequate supply of L.P.G. in Orissa

1535. SHRI BASUDEB MOHAPATRA: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the irregular and inadequate supply of cooking gas in most of the towns of Orissa presently causing great hardship to the customers;

(b) if so, what are the reasons therefor, and

(c) what steps Government propose to take to ensure regular cooking gas supplies by the various companies in Orissa?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS AND THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY, OF FINANCE (SHRI BRAHM DUTT): (a) to (c) A backlog in supply of refills developed in Orissa in the past two months on account of reduced bottling at the Haldia Plant, seasonal increase in demand and labour problems with some distributors. The endeavour of the oil companies is to augment, to the extent feasible, supplies to locations where a backlog has developed.

ARUNACHALAM): (a) The package of incentives offered by Government for attracting industrial units to backward areas are showing fairly good results as would be evident from the following numbers of Letters of Intent (LOI), Industrial Licences (IL) & ID.G.T.D. Registrations (D.G.T.D. REGNS.) granted and reimbursements made under the Central Investment Subsidy Scheme during the last 3 years:—
