Report of the Enquiry Committee on fire in Hotel Siddharth

1686. SHRI DINKARRAO GOVIND-RAO PATIL: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether enquiry into the death of persons in fire in Hotel Siddharth, Delhi has since been completed;

(b) if so, what are the details of the report and when it was submitted to Government; and

(c) what action has been taken by Government thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CHINTAMANI PANIGRAHI): (a) to (c) The Khanna Commission of Inquiry, which was appointed to inquire into the incident of fire at Hotel Siddhartha Continental, submitted its report on 13th March, 1986. The Report of the Commission alongwith the memorandum of action taken on the various recommendations made by it was laid on the Table of the Rajya Sabha on the 18th November, 1986.

The recommendations of the Commission include modernisation of Delhi Fire Service with new equipment/appliances training organisational control, raising of funds, creating fire safety cell etc.

The recommendations made by the Commission have been generally accepted and their implementation has been taken up. Delhi Administration has already taken action to fix individual responsibility.

A grant of Rs. 11.83 crores spread over 2 years has been sanctioned for improvement of Delhi Fire Service.

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI P.A. SANGMA), (a) t^, (c) No, Sir. However, the Government gives grant-in-aid to the Council for the purpose of printing and distribution of posters, industrial safety chronicle and technical booklets on safety. During the financial year 1986-87, grants in-aid amounting to Rs. 2.5 lakhs was given to the Council for this purpose.

The National Safety Council is a Registered Society and a Public Trust registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and the Bombay Public Trust Act, 1950 respectively. The main objective of the Council is to generate, develop and sustain a movement of safety awareness. The Council manages its affairs independently through its Board of Governors which, among others, consists of representatives of Central organisations of employers and workers and experts on health and safety.
