

CIS rules for fixation of inter-se seniority

2116. PROF. C. LAKSHMANNA: Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to refer to replies to Unstarred Questions 1387 and 1863 given in the Rajya Sabha on 29th March, 1985 and 17th May 1985 respectively and state:

I Whether it is a fact that the original CIS rules providing for fixation of inter-se seniority of direct recruits in any grade through proper application of normal Quota-rota principle as provided in the Ministry of Home Affairs on No. 9/H/55 RPS dated the 22nd December, 1959 were in full force till they were amended and notified on 6th January, 1982 and

applicable also to the incumbents of 1975 batch of Direct Recruits into the JAG as they were in the case of earlier 1963 and 1985 batches;

(b) if so, the reasons for denying these direct recruitments of normal by 2 to 45 positions in terms of inter-se seniority and the consequent ad-hoc and regular promotions into next higher grades, which were their legitimate due under original rules which remained unamended and continuously in full force from 1960 to 1982 without any interference from courts; and

(c) the respective dates of original irrence of these permanent vacancies against which the UPSC selected this 1975 batch of direct recruits?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI AJIT PANJIA):

(a) The Central Information Service (First amendment) Rules, 1982 made the normal Quota-rota system in applicable to the direct recruits appointed to JAG posts after the relevant date i. e. 17th July, 1974.

(b) The purpose of Recruitment Rules is to regulate appointments and promotions in a particular grade or

service in a rational manner. The Government has inherent power to amend the Rules to meet various contingencies including those which may bring distortions in a Service. This was intended to be achieved through the aforesaid amendment to CIS Rules.

c) The respective dates of original occurrence of these permanent vacancies against which the UBSC selected the 1975 batch of direct recruits are as under: —

- (1) 1st July, 1966
- (2) 4th August, 1967
- (3) 7th April, 1968
- (4) 19th June, 1970
