Teacher Strike

*28. SHRI ASHOK NATH VERMA: DR. BAPU KALDATE:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RE-SOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to refer to the answer to Unstarred Question 2493 given in the Rajya Sabha on 18th March, 1987 and state:

- (a) whether the teachers in the Government and the aided schools in Delhi recently went on a strike which continued for more than a month;
- (b) whether this strike had any adverse effect on the examinations of the students; and
 - (c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF **EDUCA-**TION AND CULTURE IN THE MI-NISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KRISHNA SAHI): (a) to (c) teachers of schools run by Administration and Municipal poration of Delhi went on sit-instrike w.e.f. 13-2-87. The teachers of N.D.M.C. Sr. Secondary Schools went on strike between 9-3-87 to 24-3-87 and N.D.M.C. Nursery And Primary School teachers went on strike between 12-3-87 to 24-3.87. They called off the strike on 25-3-87. The strike did disrupt the studies in schools. However, as far as examinations for classes X and XII concerned, out of four such examinations which are conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, only one, the Delhi Secondary Schools Examination, had to be postponed by one week owing to the strike by teachers. Internal examinations for various classes in schools were not schedued to be held in the period covered by the strike. They will be held before summer vacations.

Royalty paid by M|s. A. H. Wheeler & Company to Northern Railway
