#### Statement III

Drugs for prevention of polio, Diphtheria, Tetanus, Tuberculosis, Whooping cough and measles are mostly preventive in nature. There are vaccines and are available for the prevention of these diseases.

The drugs used for treatment jf Diarrhoea and Dysentry include non specific drugs, viz. Diphenoxylate, Loperamide, Pactin, Kaelin a"d specific drugs, viz. tetracyline, Chloremphenical, Matronidazole, Tinidarele, Furoxone, Sulfenomides. For treatment of dehydration due to diarrhoea, oral rehydration salt is used.

### New Post Offices, Telegraph Offices and Telephone Exchanges In Orissa

521. SHRI SUB AS MOHANTY: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) what is the target fixed by Government to open new Post Offices and Telegraph Offices and Telephone Exchanges in rural and urban areas in Orissa, separately during the Seventh Five Yea<sub>r</sub> Plan period;

(b) whether the target for the Sixth Plan has been fully achieved; and

(c) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI SONTOSH MOHAN DEV): (a) POSTAL: Through the, successive 'Five Year Plans, the -built up. a. Department has alresady comprehensive postal network in Orissa. At present there are 7, 535 post offices functioning in Orissa out, of which 546 are in ur-abn areas and 6, 989 in rural areas. During the first two years of the Seventh Plan, namely, 1985-86 and 1986-87, there was "no programme of rural postal extension on account of the ban on creation of posts. The Ministry of Finance have since indicated special procedures for creation/ filling up of postg required for Implementation of Plan schemes. In pursuance thereof, the Department hag worked out norms and all Circles

including Orissa have been asked to J carry out a fresh assessment in accor-dance with the norms. The proposals fOr post offices which satisfy the norma may be taken <sup>U</sup>P with the Ministry of Finance for consideration. In so far as urban areas are concerned, post offices do not come under the Plan and the ban on creation of posts fully applies to such cases.

(b) and (c) Postal: 475 rural post offices were planned for in Orissa during the Sixth Five Year Plan. 377 post offices were actually opened. On account of the intervention of the ban on creation of postg in January, 1984, the target fixed for 1983-84 partial'. y fulfilled (123 post offices as against the target of 135). The target for 1984-85 could not be fulfilled but on special consideration 3 rural post offices were opened in that year by relaxation of the ban,

(c) As against targets of 380 offices to be opened, 343 offices were opened during 6th Five Year Plan. The shortfall of 37 wag the to short supply of line materials.

# Programme to encourage Naturopathy In the country

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THEI MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY (KUMARI WELFARE SAROJ KHAPARDE); (a) With a view to popularise Naturopathy, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare have decided to set-up the National Institute ot Naturopathy at Pune. An outlay of Rs. 1. 00 crore has been earmarked for the purpose during the Seventh Five Year Plan. In addition, an outlay of Rs. 70. 00 lakhs has been earmarked for financial assistance to the various Yoga and Naturopathy Institutions in the country through the Central Council for Research in Yoga a\$d Naturopathy in the Seventh Plan.

### Expenditure on Family Planning Programme

523. SHRI SANTOSB BAGRODIA: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state the expenditure involved due to incentives to be given to make the family planning programme more effective during the 1987-88?

THF MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MIIVISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY (KUMARI WELFARE SAROJ KHAPARDE): Government of India gives no incentives to members of general public who accept family planning. All acceptors of terminal methods of family planning and IUD insertion are, however, entitled to a compensation of Rs. 1D0 and Rs. 9 repeetively for wages lost. For the purpose, ' a sum of Rs. 86. 00 crores under the head 'Compensation' has been earmarekd for 1987-88. States have also been requested to- give all acceptors 5 lottery tickets and green cards to acceptors with 1-2 children entitling them to avail certain facilities being given by the States /Union Territories. During 1987-88. 'Rs. 0. 50 crofe has been allocated for the Green Cird scheme.
