

### केन्द्रीय सरकार स्वास्थ्य योजना के अधीन अस्पताल

573. डा० रत्नाकर पाण्डेय : क्या स्वास्थ्य और परिवार कल्याण मंत्री यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि :

(क) केन्द्रीय सरकार स्वास्थ्य योजना के अधीन विभिन्न नगरों में अब तक कितने अस्पताल खोले गए हैं ;

(ख) इस योजना के अधीन कुल कितने प्रतिशत केन्द्रीय सरकारी कर्मचारी लाभान्वित हो रहे हैं ; और

(ग) सातवीं पंचवर्षीय योजना के दौरान किन-किन नगरों तक इस सेवा का विस्तार किया जाएगा और उसके परिणामस्वरूप कितने प्रतिशत केन्द्रीय सरकारी कर्मचारी इस सेवा से लाभान्वित होंगे ?

स्वास्थ्य और परिवार कल्याण मंत्रालय में राज्य मंत्री (कुमारी सरोज खापड़ें) : (क) से (ग) केन्द्रीय सरकार स्वास्थ्य योजना, दिल्ली के अधीन पांच अस्पताल कार्य कर रहे हैं। अन्य शहरों में जहाँ केन्द्रीय सरकार स्वास्थ्य योजना चल रही है, सरकारी अस्पतालों, राज्य सरकार/नगर पालिका के अस्पतालों तथा प्रख्यात प्राइवेट अस्पतालों को इस योजना के अधीन मान्यता दी गई है। पेंशन-भोगियों तथा उनके परिवार के सदस्यों सहित इस समय 31,79,441 केन्द्रीय कर्मचारियों को इस योजना के अन्तर्गत लाया गया है। सातवीं पंचवर्षीय योजना के दौरान इस स्कीम का दो नए शहरों, नामतः जबलपुर तथा अमृतसर में विस्तार किए जाने का प्रस्ताव है।

#### Modernisation of telecommunication system

575. S. HRI V. NARAYANSAMY: Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have planned to modernise the telecommunication system in the country;

(b) whether Government are aware of the fact that the electronic digital switching system is more suited for Indian conditions because of the heavy demand for telephone connections;

(c) whether it is a fact that the functioning of the telephone exchanges are tardy and they are not giving better services to the customers; and

(d) if so, what steps Government have taken to improve the position?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI SANTOSH MOHAN DEV): (a) Yes, Sir.

(c) The functioning of telephone exchanges is generally satisfactory. However, in some areas it may not be as good as per the expectations of the customers.

(d) Steps being taken to improve the telecommunications services are as under;

(i) Introduction of sophisticated electronic telephone exchanges to avoid problems inherited with Electro Mechanical switching equipment used hitherto.

(ii) Replacement of life expired equipment.

(iii) Intensive testing of exchange equipment and rectification of faults.

(iv) Vigorous monitoring of air-conditioning plants working in the exchanges.

(v) Laying of new junction, primary and secondary cables in ducts to protect them from external damage.

(vi) Pressurisation of primary, secondary, and junction cables to minimise cable break down fault

(vii) Rehabilitation of subscribers fittings and ESP boxes to minimise faults on the lines.

(viii) Replacement of overhead wires by insulated drop wires and underground cables to avoid faults due to kite strings, bird nests etc.

(ix) Use of improved telephone instruments.

(x) Opening of public grievance cells at GM and Area Manager Offices to provide single outlet attention to subscribers.

(xi) A Mission 'Better Communication' has been launched to improve the telecom system in India.
