Utilisation of the financial aid to West Bengal

695. SHRIMATI KANAK MUKHERJEE: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether he promised to disburse 1007 crores of rupees for the economic development of West Bengal in September, 1986;

(b) if so, the total amount disbursed upto date;

(c) what are the details of the disbursement; and

(d) by when the balance amount would be disbursed?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI SUKH RAM): (a) to (d) The Prime Minister announced a package of Rs. 684 crores in September, 1986, which subsequently worked out to Rs. 1007 crores. This package included programmes/projects within the purview of financial institutions and Plan and non-plan schemes of the Central and the State Governments. The Planning Commission does not disburse funds for programmes/projects. Funds are released by the concerned Central Ministries/Financial Institutions on the basis of the examination of the proposals/projects after considering various relevant factors like progress of work and stage of implementation.
