962. SHRI BIR BHAQRA PRATAP SINGH: Will the Minister of DEFENCE, "be pleased to state:

(a) whether *it* is a fact that Maza-gon Dock Limited has suffered an immense loss of money and reputation as a result of gross mismanagement and dishonest policies carried out by some of its top officials in the past few years;

(b) if so^ what are details thereof including the losses incurred in various projects, the action take against each one of those officials and " the steps taken to ensure that such things do, not take place in future; and '

(c.) what are the details of the, work subcontracted by Mazagaon Dock Ltd, foreign companies for oil and oil-related projects?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE PRO*DUCTION AND SUPPLIES IN THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE CSHRI SHIVRAJ PATIL: (a) Mazagaon Dock Limited suffered a net loss of ' Rs. 12. 94 crores and Rs. 38. 97 crores (including Rs. 19. 61 crores on account of previous years adjustments) during 1984-85 and 1985-86 respectively • Losses were occasioned due to a host of factors like serious time - and cost overruns, high cost of operations, unremunerative prices on certain projects inadequate financial ana ac-counting systems, as well as very unsatisfactory performance of top man-

agement, of the Company. However nothing has come to the notice of tha " Government to establish that losses could be attributed to any dishonest policies on the part of any of the top ' official Of the Company..

(b) The Company suffered losses largely on various projects in respect of {activities relating to production transportation and installation of off shore structureslvessels. Action was taken against the top management of the Company by ordering immediate removal of. the then Chairman-cum-Managing Director (Finance) in December. 1985 • and it was also decided to replace the then Director (Offshore) and DIPedtor (Shipbuilding). The

Company has undertaken various remedial steps including revamping of the Financial Management System% build up of organisation proper reporting and monitoring reduction in capital expenditure measures aimed

, at reduction in costs an fimpzoyement in productivity. The Company has also set up a Task Force to ca-rv out audit of its operation/ from the point of view of echno-economic viability of various projects and operations; review of investment decisions in re; oect of capital projects,. diversification plansj , programmes and formulation of guide" lines for future growth.

(c) Various works related to offshare activities were subcontracted by the • Company to foreign firms Wherever considered necessary to provide technical back-up and due to nossvailabi Mity or limited availablj. it voi indige-neuos capabilities.. Type of work subcontracted includes fabrication of structures transportation innallatio'-hook-up and commissioning of HPfshore structures including pipe-laying riser installation buria lof pipelines; specialised support for operations like grouting, positioning surveys etc; technical and specialised assistance for activities like fabrication' drivng ser-vietes "equipment^ management and' engineeringjj. services.
