

Government have seen press reports in this regard.

(b) According to these reports, till November 1986, weapons and ammunition worth 32 million Swiss Francs have been sold to Pakistan while it is apparently Swiss policy not to disclose the nature of weapons and war material sold to any country, the reports indicate these included 23 mm and 35 mm anti aircraft guns, skyguard fire control systems and ammunition.

(c) Yes, Sir.

(d) We were informed that the weapons sold to Pakistan were on a commercial basis and for defensive purposes. Furthermore that the same Swiss company will entertain similar requests for arms from India.

**Development of Surrli Falls in Madu-rai District of Tamil Nadu as a Tourist Spot**

**Madras Export Processing Zone**

Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) when the Madras Export Processing Zone was set up;

(b) what was the area originally required; the plan outlay, the total number of export processing units to be set up and expected strength of workforce to be employed and other details thereof;

(c) what are the details regarding, the area developed, the number of units set up, the total work-force employed and the total [amount of exports since its inception as on date;

(d) what are the future plans for development of this Zone and the likely investment and "the number of units, along with the targeted export;

(e) how many out of these are NR4 units and investments made therein; and

(f) what steps are being taken to provide infrastructure facilities, including water Power and other raw materials to the present units and also for the units to be set up in future?

THE MINISTER OF COMMERCE (SHRI P. SHIV SHANKER): (a) Madras Export Processing Zone was declared a Customs bonded area through a Gazette Notification dated 16. 8. 1985.

(b) The Zone has been set up in an area of about 98 acres with a plan outlay of Rs. 10. 44 crores towards capital expenditure. It is anticipated that there will be 120 industrial units in the first phase employing a substantial number of industrial and managerial workforce.
