### **Killing of Persons of T.N.V. Volunteers in Tripura**

3208. SHRI MAHENDRA PRASAD:

SHRI MURLIDHAR CHANDRAKANT BHANDARE:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that at least 14 persons including 5 women and two children were killed by a gang of tribal national volunteers in Tripura near Srirampur village on August 30, 1986;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof;

(c) what specific steps have been taken to prevent such incidents in Tripura; and

(d) the number and details of such incidents in Tripura during the year 1986 so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI CHINTAMANI PANIGRAHI):

(a) and (b) On 29th August, 1986 an armed group of tribal extremists belonging to TNV raided the houses of some non-tribals as also a grocery shop owned by another non-tribal at Srirampur village, near Manik Bhandar under PS Kamalpur (North Tripura), around 20,00 hours. The TNV extremists opened fire indiscriminately on the inmates of the houses/shop resulting in the death of 8 persons on the spot. Six more persons succumbed to their injuries in the Kamalpur hospital. The deceased include 7 men, 5 women and 2 children. Besides, 5 more persons, who sustained serious injuries, were removed to the G.B. Hospital at Agartala. This incident took place on 29th August and not 30th August as mentioned in the question.

(c) The State Government of Tripura have been requested to take suitable measures to effectively deal with the activities of extremists in Tripura. Para-military

forces have been placed at the disposal of the State Government for the purpose.

(d) According to the State Government there were 20 incidents with 65 deaths upto 15-11-1986 during 1986.
