**Missing items from National Museums,  
Delhi**

\*29. SHRI MOSTAFA BIN QUASEM: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that a number of invaluable items are missing from the National Museum in Delhi which include the 200 year old *Hookah* and Moghul Emperor Jahangir's scarf;

(b) whether Government have fixed the responsibility for such missing items, if so, the details thereof; and

(c) whether any of the items are expected to be recovered?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KRISHNA SAHI): (a) Government are aware that two objects namely a tiny "Munal" of *Hookah* belonging to the Indian Museum, Calcutta and a

Golconda 'Rumal' belonging to the National Museum, New Delhi have been missing while in the custody of the National Museum. No further report on any more missing items has been received from the National Museum.

(b) Action to fix responsibility for these missing items is in progress.

(c) Reports of the missing items have been lodged with the Police. It is difficult to say whether any of these items will be recovered.

**Rise in the incidents of Malaria**

\*30. SHRI AJIT P. K. JOGI: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have received reports that the incidence of Malaria is registering alarming rise in certain parts of the country especially in the tribal belts of Central India;

(b) if so, what steps the Government propose to take for meeting the situation; and

(c) whether it is a fact that resource constraints and non-availability of insecticides continue to impede the success of the malaria eradication programme?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (KUMARI SAROJ KHA-PARDE): (a) and (b) According to the latest malaria situation reports received from the State Health Authorities, there is decline of 8.98 per cent in total malaria cases in 1986 as compared to that during the corresponding period of 1985. However there is slight increase in the number of malaria cases during this period in some States/Union Territories like Assam, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Orissa, Tripura, West Bengal, Dadra and Nagar Haveli, Goa, Daman and Diu and Mizoram. However, malaria incidence has shown declining trend in the tribal belt of Central India.

(c) No, Sir.

**Air-taxi service between Andaman and Nicobar Islands**

\*31. SHRI K. VASUDEVA PANICKER:

SHRI MAHENDRA PRASAD:

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether a proposal for development of a helicopter and air taxi service between the Islands of Andaman and Nicobar region had been mooted at a three day workshop held at the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research in New Delhi which concluded on 22nd September, 1986; and

(b) if not, which of the States are still in favour thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI JAGDISH TYTLER): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Government have already approved in principle a scheme to operate air taxi services in the country. A proposal for providing helicopter services to the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Administration is also under active consideration.

(b) what are the details of the recommendations made therein;

(c) what action Government have taken on each recommendation;

(d) whether the Commission's report is proposed to be laid on the Table of the House, if not, the reasons therefor; and

(e) by what date revised pay scales are likely to be given effect to?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI KRISHNA SAHI): (a) to (e) The National Commission on Teachers-I (NCT-I) headed by Prof. D. P. Chattopadhyaya submitted its report to the Government on 26th March, 1985. The main recommendations of the NCT-I are annexed. [See Appendix CXL, Annexure No. 4]

2. The Government of India appointed an Empowered Committee headed by the Secretary in the Department of Education in Government of India to examine the recommendations made by the NCT-I.
