

(b) Our experience at Kota, Tara-pur and Madras have been satisfactory with regard to operational safety. However, in the light of Chernobyl accident, Task Forces have been set up by the Nuclear Power Board and Department of Atomic Energy Safety Review Committee to review the safety aspects of our power stations even though Indian reactors are of a different type. It is proposed to apply the lessons learnt from such incidents in an appropriate manner to further improve the safety aspects of Indian Nuclear Power Stations. Government considers it desirable to exploit all available and feasible sources of power—hydel thermal and nuclear.

**Vacant posts of IPS Officers in Jammu and Kashmir**

(a) the number of posts which are vacant to be filled by the IPS officers in the Jammu and Kashmir State; and

The number of vacant posts in the IPS Cadre of Jammu and Kashmir is 40. Out of these 40 vacant posts, 31 posts have arisen with effect from 1.8.86, when the authorised strength of the IPC Cadre of the State was increased from 49 to 80 following its triennial review.
