**Indian nationals detained in  
Burmese jails**

790. DR. MOHD. HUSHIM KID-WAI: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that some Indian nationals have been detained in Burmese jails;

(b) if so, what is the number thereof; and

(c) what steps have been taken by Government for their speedy release?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. NATWAR SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The total number of Indian detainees in Burma as on October 30, 1986 is forty one.

(c) Government have taken up all the cases with the Government of

Burma for their release or deportation. In the case of two Indian arrested recently, the Burmese authorities have been requested to furnish necessary details.

**Universal disarmament**
