- (a) the amount of money the Indian Railways have been paying to the private parties specially traders of perishable items as claims for damages per year during the last 3 years.
- (b) what is the reason for paying such huge amount; and
- (c) what steps Government have taken to verify the number of true claims and what steps have been taken to check this malpractice?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) The amount of compensation paid for loss of and damage to booked consignments are not maintained separately for private parties and other parties. However, the total amount of compensation paid to all parties on perishable items during the last 3 years has been as under: —

- (c) Claims are paid after proper verification of loss in accordance with provision of Indian Railways Act. Claimsi which are not tenable are repudiated. Claims prevention measures are being regularly taken to minimise inci. dsnts of loss, damage, etc.
