Rural Electrification in Maharashtra

The Rural Electrification Corporation received from Maharashtra State Electricity Board rural electrification proposals envisaging a loan assistance of Rs. 1749 lakhs from 1-4-1985 to 30-9-1986 (during Seventh Plan) for electrification of 281 villages, energisation of 38417 pumpsets etc. The REC have since sanctioned a loan assistance of Rs. lakhs.

For the Seventh Plan, the Planning Commission has recommended an outlay of Rs. 263.36 crores of RE Programme in the State of Maharashtra,
