THE MINISTER OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI K. C. PANT): (a) to (c)

The Steel Authority of India Ltd. (SAIL) have been importing low ash metallurgical coking coal of prime grade variety primarily to cover the shortfall between the yearly coking coal requirement and corresponding availability from domestic sources.
