

(d) what are the steps taken by Government to minimise the delay in implementation of this project; and

(e) what is the estimated escalation in project cost due to this delay and whether it is proposed to identify and fix responsibility for this delay on concerned departments or individuals and take suitable action against them, if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF WATER RESOURCES (SHRI B. SHANKARANAND): (a) to (e) Sardar Sarovar Project has been found acceptable by the Technical Advisory Committees of the Planning Commission and is pending clearance from environmental and forest angle. Meanwhile construction of canal and foundation work or dam are in progress. The expenditure incurred till September 1986, is Rs. 355 crores. The commitment charges are borne by Government of India and Government of Gujarat are not required to make any payment on this account. The increase in cost of a project is due to many factors including price increase due to delay. It is difficult to estimate the increase in cost due to delay in implementation.

Bagging of fertilizer of projects by SNAM!

2478. SHRIMATI RENUKA CHOWDHURY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased, to state;

(a) whether it is a fact that SNAM has bagged fertilizer projects in our country in a row as reported in the 'Sunday Observer' of 26th October, 1986;

(b) if so, what are the details thereof and reasons for importing one type of technology for the above projects; and

(c) the steps taken by Government to ensure that chemical fertilizers are used in conjunction with organic fertilizers?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF FERTILIZER IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI R. PRABHU): (a) and (b) Urea technology of Snamprogetti was selected in 1979 after a global evaluation by an

Expert Group. Accordingly, consultancy services of Snamprogetti have been utilised for the Thai Project of Rashtriya Chemicals & Fertilisers Ltd., Hazira project of KRIBHCO (both Vi Plan projects), Guna project of National Fertilizers Limited, Aonla project of IFFCO and Jadishpur project of Indo-Gulf Fertilizers & Chemicals Corporation Ltd. (VII Plan projects).

(c) The State Governments are being advised regularly to promote the use of organic manures along with chemical fertilizers. As a result of these efforts, it is estimated that about 241.7 million tonnes of compost were utilised in 1985-86 to supplement the use of chemical fertilizers.

(e) what steps Government propose to take to ensure that all members of the Society are Indian Nationals and those who have changed their nationality are not allowed to transfer their shares; and

(f) what are the names of persons which have been kept in waiting list and have since deposited the share money and membership enrolment fee and whether their money have been accounted for, if so, what are the Priority of persons in waiting list as per date of issue of receipt to them?
