to uses of 6 APA from two angles, one from the lack of supply — there is a big gap between supply and demand—and also from the price angle. A number of incentives have been given to the indigenous producers. I have listed some already in Part 'C of my answer. The others are like this; A number drugs have been identified by the manufacturers and are allowed minimum economic capacity; we have allowed some of these units to go up to a certain limit so that the production increases and the cost goes down. Then, in May/June, 1985, 94 bulk drugs and intermediates were de-licensed for production in the country. This is another step. Then, registrations with the DGTD are freely allowed to companies other than FERA and MRTP companies. Then, import of technology involving onetime payment, that is lumpsum payment, royalty payment, etc. are allowed depending on merits. These are some of the measures which we have taken to encourage indigenous production in the country.

SHRI R. K. JAICHANDRA SINGH: Sir, the question of self-sufficiency is a very wideranging question because, as you know, in the drugs and pharmaceuticals world, a number of new drugs are being introduced. A drug which was introduced, ten years ago as become obsolete. Therefore, on the question of a particular country being self-sufficient on drugs, I don't think any country in the world is self-sufficient on its own. Each one of us will have to depend on something or the other, on same drug or the other on the other parts of the world. And, Sir, about the export-import balance, I may just say for the benefit of the hon. Members in the House that the exports in our country during the last three years have risen from Rs. 205 crores to Rs. 296 crores in 1984-85, and they came down slightly to Rs. 253 crores in 1985-86. The corresponding figures for imports are like this: As against Rs. 205 crores of exports in 1983-84, the imports were of the order of Rs. 158 crores. Therefore, the export
