

the Youth Hostels. Catering is under- . taken by the Warden either directly or through contractos on no profit no loss basis.

2. Seven Youth Hostels at Shillong (Meghalaya), Dimapiir (Nagaland), Imphal (Manipur), Agra (U.P.), Ita-nagar (Arunachal Pradesh) Patna (Bihar) and Namuch (Sikkim) are in dilTerent stages of construction. The Youth Hostels at Gauhati (Assam), Agartala (Tripura) and Aizwal (Mizoram) will he taken up as soon as the land is made available by the Stale Government. The Youth Hostess at Tirupati (Andhra Pradesh), Kuru-kshetra (Haryana), Ernakulam and Calicut (Kerala), Tirunelveli and Ma-durai (Tamil Nadu) and Patiala (Punjab), Jabalpur (Madhya Pradesh), Tura (Meghalaya) and Gopalpur-on-Sea (Orissa) have already been approved lor construction during the current financial year.

3. In addition to the Youth Hostels sanctioned by the Deptt. ol Youth Affairs and Sports, the folowing steps, *inter-alia*, are bsiag taken by the Deptt. of Tourism to encourage domestic tourism: by the youths in the country. *Yatri Niwas*:

It is proposed to construct atleast one Yatri Niwas in each State/Union Territory during the 7th Five Year Plan.

Yatrikas:

It is proposed to construct 50 yat rikas at selected religious places during the 7th Five Year P^an by Bharti Yatri Aawas Vikas Samiti. The Deptt. of Tourism will bear 90 per cent of the cost of construction -of the yatrik

The Deptt. of Tourism is also building forest lodges in various Wild Life Sancturries.

Conflict Ietween Medical Store Depot and the principal testing centres >n Madras

1189. SHRI VALAMPURI JOHN : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware of the perpetual conflict between the

Medical Stores Depots and the Principal Testing Centres in Madras such as the Biological Laboratory and Animal House;

(b) whether it is a fact that medicines are tested in the private drug testing laboratories while the Biological Laboratory and Animal House are fully equipped;

(b) if so the details thereof

(d) whether Government are aware of the fact that condoms, bandages, and sutures are tested at private laboratories at the cost of Rs. 100/- per sample for want of a Tensile meter; and - (e) if so, what steps Government have taken to end wasteful expenditure in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY WELFARE (SHRI S. KRISHNA KUMAR): (a) There is no perpetual conflict between the Medical Stores Depots of the Medical Stores Organisation and the Biological Laboratory, Madras. However, some problems exist between the Government Medical Store Depot, Madras and the Biological Laboratory, Madras. Government are trying to sort these out.

(b) In view of the importance of time factor in drug test as also due to the distance between the Bio-lab., Madras and the Medical Stores Depots, facilities at Government approved private testing laboratories are also availed of.

(c) The requisite information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the Sabha.

(d) Bandages and sutures are being tested for quality at the Bio-lab., Madras, but condoms are tested exclusively at the I.G.S. Lab. as per terms and conditions of D.G.S.&D contracts.

(e) In view of this position, the question of wasteful expenditure does not arise.

Food for learning Project

1191. SHRI VALAMPURI JOHN : Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that 'Food for Learning Project' to benefit lakhs of girls in rural areas has failed to take off for nearly three years now;

(b) if so, what are the reasons therefor; and

(c) whether there is any proposal to reformulate the project?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENTS OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE (SHRIMATI SUSHILA ROHTAGI) : (a) to (c) No specific 'Food for Learning Project' was taken up for implementation but Dr. M. S. Swaminathan, formerly Member, Planning Commission had sent a copy of the talk delivered by him in February, 1982 to the then Minister of State for Education wherein he had mooted the idea of such a project. He suggested that a few pilot projects in suitable areas be considered for being taken up with 'World Food Programme' assistance.

This idea was examined and given shape in consultation with concerned Ministries and 15 States and 3 Union Territories, where enrolment ratio was less than 70 per cent in res-
