- (c) whether it is also a fact that most of Welfare Officers of various colonies belong to the Ministries of Home Affairs and Personnel and Administrative Reforms; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSION (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM): (a) The Government appoints gazetted officers who are willing to work in Honorary capacity as Area Welfare Officers for various colonies and areas 3n Delhi. While selecting them, preference is given to those who have residential telephones.

- (b) All Area Welfare Officers ap-poined are gazetted officers. Eighteen of them do not have residential telephones.
- (c) Out of the 68 Area Welfare Officers in Delhi, only six are from Ministry of Home Affairs and seven are from Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pen-ions.
