

Foreign fund for various Organisations

1298. SHRI DEBENDRA NATH BARMAN: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state;

(a) whether the Ashoka Society, New Delhi, International Council for Research on International Economic Relations, New Delhi, and the Centre for the Study of Developing Societies, New Delhi received funds under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act;

(b) if so, the amounts received for the years 1981, 1982, 1983 and 1984, organisation-wise; and

(c) the countries from which funds have originated and the names of the organisations which have contributed the same?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERNAL SECURITY (SHRI ARUN NEHRU): (a) Out of the three associations, only Centre for the Study of Developing Societies, New Delhi has reported the receipt of funds under the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act.

Taking up the Issue of Arms Training to Sikh Extremists with US

1299. PROF. C. LAKSHMANNA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the question of stopping arms training to Sikh extremists in the training camps in US was taken up with the United States Government;

(b) whether any decision has been taken by the US Government to put a ban on arms training of Sikh extremists; and

(c) if not, what action is proposed to be taken by Government in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. R. NARAYANAN): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) With effect from January 1985, US law has provided that a licence is required by any training camp before it can impart training to a foreign national in the use of weapons.

(c) Government have requested the US Government to take effective action to deny extremists and terrorists the opportunity of getting training in the USA and to use that country as a base for operations against India.

Apprehensions of Nuclear war due to Indo-Pak Clash

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(b) what action Government propose to take to prevent such an eventuality?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI K. R. NARAYANAN): (a) and (b) Yes Sir. The non-peaceful dimension of Pakistan's nuclear programme has been a matter of concern for India. Government's policy continues to be the same as before, and Government keeps a close vigil on all developments having a bearing on the country's security.

Satellite launcher

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF OCEAN DEVELOPMENT, ATOMIC ENERGY, ELECTRONICS AND SPACE (SHRI SHIVRAJ PATIL): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The major Indian Space Missions for the decade 1985—95 include the development of the following launch vehicles, viz., Augmented Satellite Launch Vehicle (ASLV), Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV), and Geosynchronous Launch Vehicle (GSLV). The first ASLV developmental flight, capable of placing 150 kg class payload in low earth orbit is scheduled for launch in 1986. The second developmental flight of ASLV is scheduled for 1987, with a nominal plan for 2 operational flights in 1989 and 1990. The first PSLV developmental flight capable of placing 1000 kg class payload in sun-synchronous polar orbit of 900 k.m. is scheduled for launch in 1989, followed by the second developmental
