

charge of negligence of duty, wilful absence, misbehaviour or involvement in smuggling of smark, etc. In the 22 cases in which enquiry has been completed, 10 have been issued warning/censured. In 6 cases the punishments of withholding of increment/reduction in pay have been awarded. In the remaining cases, the charges against the concerned officials were not proved.

(b) 238 additional posts including the post of full-time I.G. (Prison) have been sanctioned for the Central jail, Tihar. 6 more vehicles have also been sanctioned. A number of walkie-talkie and wireless sets have been provided and a control room has been set up at Tihar Jail.

(c) During the year 1983, 3 complaints were received and in the year 1985 one complaint was received.
