- 292. SHRI PAWAN KUMAR BANSAL : Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state :

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT .AND FORESTS (SHRI Z.R. ANSARI): (a) The Fuel Wood Study Committee recommended setting up of the annual fuel wood plantation programme up to about 1.5 million hectares and distribution of seedlings the to extent of about 800 million per annum during the next io years.

(b) During the period 1982-85 the cumulative achievements against the above targets in respect of plantations and distribution of seedlings has been 42 percent and 140 percent respectively.
