

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES AND PENSIONS (SHRI P. CHIDAMBARAM): (a) and (b) Five Benches of Central Administrative Tribunal were established on 1-11-1985 at New Delhi, Allahabad, Calcutta, Madras and New Bombay and three more Benches of the Tribunal were established at Bangalore, Chandigarh and Guwahati on 3-3-1986. It is proposed to establish seven more Benches of the Central Administrative Tribunal at Ahmedabad, Cuttack, Ernakulam, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Jodhpur and Patna by 30-6-1986.

**National Register of citizens in Assam and N. E. region**

227. SHRIMATI BIJOYA CHAKRAVARTY: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state what steps Government have taken to prepare a National Register of citizens in Assam and North-Eastern region?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS AND IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI RAM NIWAS MIRDHA): There is no proposal at present to prepare a National Register of Citizens in Assam and North-Eastern Region.

**Contract Labour engaged in the Bharat Electronics Limited, Ghaziabad**

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENCE PRODUCTION AND DEFENCE SUPPLIES (SHRI SUKHAM): (a) While no contract labour is engaged, BEL do award contracts for jobs of seasonal or special nature, not connected with the manufacturing process. Labour engaged on such jobs are not employees of BEL.
