It is, therefore, not possible at this stage to indicate the number of branches and the locations where bank branches may be opened in Pauri Garhwal District durnig the current financial year. RBI has not received any application fiom any public sector bank for opening a Bank branch at G.iaadiyal, D.strict P^uri Garhwal. The question of opening a bank office at Ghandiyal will be considered by RBI on merits if it is included in the list of identified centres as finalised by the State Government of Utter Pradesh.

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI P. A. SANGMA): (a) during the year 1985, 8758 bonded labourers were idl ntific d and freed in Orissa and 4163 in Uttar Pradesh. The number of bondid labouiers id' ntific d and freed in Orissa and Uttar Pradesh during January and Fibiuary, 1986 was 187 and 1270 respectively. The commulative total of bonded labourers identified and freed in Orissa and Uttar Pardesh upto the end of February, 1986 was 42,183 and 17,499 respectively.

- (b) A total of 29,105 bonded labourers have been n habilitated in Orissa and 15,229 in Uttar Pradesh upto the end of February, 1986.
- (c) A sum of Rs. 617.32 lakhs has been released to the Government of Orissa and Rs. 319.22 lakhs to the Government of Uttar Pradesh towards the central share of assistance under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Rehabilitation of bonded labourers since the inceptin ofthe scheme in 1978-79 till 31st March, 1986.
