THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF RAILWAYS (SHRI MADHAVRAO SCINDIA): (a) About 52,000 overaged Broad Gauge and Metre Gauge wagons are required to be replaced during the Seventh Five Year Plan.

(b) Provision has been made in the Seventh Plan for acquisition of 96,000 wagons to meet the needs or replacement and the anticipated growth of freight traffic.

West Bengal Government's stand on Model Schools

736. SHRIMATI KANAK MUK-HERJEE: Will the Minister of HU-MAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Shri Kanti Biswas, Minister, Secondary education, Government of West Bengal, has in a letter addressed to him, conveyed the views of West Bengal Government on the proposed Model School Scheme, if so, what are the details thereof; and
- (b) what is Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCA-TION AND CULTURE (SHRIMATI SUSHILA ROHATGI): (a) Yes, Sir. In his letter dated 2nd April, 1986 the Minister-in-charge of Primary and Secondary Education, Government of West Bengal has stated, among other things, that the resources of Government should be utilised for establish. ing new Primary and Secondary schools. improving the existing schools and launching various incentive programmes, to ensure universal enrolment and retention of all the children in the age group 6 to14 years rather than for the setting up of a few elitist Navodaya Vidyalayas. He has also stated that in the Navodaya Vidyalayas English and Hindi are proposed to be simultaniously used as medium of instruction and mother tongue is to be taught as a third language in non-Hindi areas which is against the accepted principle of educating children in their mother tongue. He has requested for details of the scheme of setting up Navodays Vidyalayas in each District of the country so that they can take further action in the matter.

(b) The scheme to set up Navoday: Vidyalayas in each District has been largely welcomed by the State Gov ernments. The broad aims for esta blishment of Navodaya Vidyalayas ar to serve the objective of equity and social justice, promote national integ ration, provide opportunities to the talented children to develop their full potential and facilitate the na tion-wide programme of school imp rovement. These Vidyalayas are de signed to make available good edu cation to children from rural area particularly those from weaker sec tions of the society. Hindi and Eng lish will be the medium of instruc tion in these schools and a Moder Indian language would be taught a a third language. However. most of the students entering Navo daya Vidyalayas in Class-VI would know only their mother tongue/re gional language when they are ad mitted in class VI, a transition period of 2-3 years will be provided during which the regional language will b the main medium alongwith intensiv teaching of Hindi/English subject₁₃ and as co-medium so tha there would be no difficulty in swit ching over to Hindi and English a medium of instruction after this stage The details of the scheme are being despatched to the Hon'ble Minister.
