

are alternative raw materials for manufacture of Polyester. PTA is a later entrant and stoichiometrically more DMT is required than PTA for one tonne Polyester.

(b) The requirement of DMT and PTA depends on the users who would assess their needs based on the various factors like existing equipment, additional facilities required etc. Government's policy would be to meet the demands of both DMT and PTA to the extent these items are required by the user industry.
