' (c) Government is fully committed combat the menace of black money. All possible measures to curb generation black money, legislative, administrative and institutional, are being taken from time to time. As a result of liberal fiscal policies, revenue collections have gone up in the last financial year. The liberalisation of Summary Assessment Scheme and reduction in the tax rates of direct taxes is, however, only one limb of the policy. The other limb is intensive scrutiny and searches and seizures in the remaining cases so as to leave no doubts in the minds of taxpayers that they cannot get away with anything they declare in their returns of income. Enforcement machinery being strengthened and the number of searches have substantially increased.

Purchase of tobacco by S. T. C.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRT BRAHM DUTT); (a) Virginia Tobacco is being purchased by the registered exporters and dealers in tobacco at various auction platforms operated by the Tobacco Board in Andhra Pradesh Karnataka.

- (b) The auction system ensures compotition among the bidders and hence reasonable returns to the growers. The Tobacco Board steps in if there are no bidders at the minimum support price. Hence the necessity for STC to operate in a big way like the FCI has not been felt.

Steps to improve the functioning of the Income Tax Department

1383. SHRI KAILASH PATI MISHRA; Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the number of ITOs. Assistant Commissioners and Commissioners of Income-tax in the Income-tax Department who were (i) dismissed compulsorily retired and (ii) suspended and on whom major and minor penalties were emposed or inquiries conducted by the C.B.I. during the years 1984, 1985 and 1986 (upto June, 1986) on charges of corruption, ininefficiency disproportionate assets and dereliction of duty;
- (b) whether it is a fact that corruption is rampant in the Income-tax Department; and
- (c) whether Government propose to appoint and Expert Committee to suggest steps to revamp and reorganise the administrative machinery in the Income-tax Department; if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI JAN-ARDHAN POOJARI): (a) (i) and (ii) In 1984, four ITOs were dismissed/compulsorily retired removed from service and 10 ITOs were suspended. Major penalty was imposed on one ITO on charges of corruption and inefficiency on the basis of enquiries conducted by the C.B.I.

In 1985, 4 ITOs, were dismissed or compulsorily retired or removed from service and 13 ITOs were suspended. Minor penalty was imposed on one ITO

on the basis of enquiries conducted by the C.B.I. 3 Inspecting Assistant Commissioners and 1 Commissioner of Income Tax were suspended.

In 1986, 2 ITOs were dismissed or company my retired or removed from service and 2 ITOs were suspended.

- (b) No, Sir. There is no material to show that corruption is rampant in the Income-tax Department.
