### Superfast Trains

1431. DR. MOHD HASHIM KIDWAI: Will the Minister of TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

(a) the number of superfast trains introduced till March, 1986 Zone wise;

(b) the number of superfast trains introduced in April, 1986; and

(c) the number of conductors and other members of the running staff on these trains?

THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT (SHRIMATI MOHSINA KIDWAI):

(a) Forty one Superfast trains were running on the Railways. Most of these trains cover more than one Zone.

(c) This information is not being maintained in the Railway Board, and the number of staff keeping changing.

### Filling up Posts of Teachers in Delhi Administration Schools

1432. DR. MOHD. HASHIM KIDWAI: Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) the number of posts of primary and secondary teachers lying vacant in Delhi Administration Schools as on July 1, 1986;

(b) what steps Government have taken to fill up these posts; and

(c) the reasons for delay in filling up the vacant posts of teachers so far?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND CULTURE (SHRIMATI KRISHNA SAHI): (a) As reported by New Delhi Municipal Committee/Delhi Administration, 6 posts of primary teachers

and 894 posts of secondary teachers were lying vacant as on July 1, 1986.

(b) and (c) Filling up of posts is a continuous process. The procedural requirements like calling of names from Employment Exchange, preparation of eligibility list, conducting of interviews and issuing of offer of appointments etc., besides convening of Departmental promotion Committees, all take considerable time. Till the procedural requirements are completed, the posts remain vacant. Delhi Administration is, however, making all efforts to ensure that the posts are filled up as soon as possible.
