THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI M. ARUNACHALAM): (a) to (c) It has been brought to the notice of Government that the Indian Book Industry is facing some constraints because of the rising prices of various inputs. In so far as paper is concerned, Government have taken a number of steps to increase its production and improve its quality. These include fiscal reliefs, facility of duty-free import of pulp, wood chips and waste paper, etc. As a result of the various steps taken, the production of paper has increased from 13.70 lakh tonnes in 1984 to 15.00 lakh tonnes (estimated) in 1985. The National Book Development Council has submitted a report entitled "Towards a National Book Policy." This report has made several recommendations to improve the condition of the publishing industry. According to the Ministry of Human Resource Development, these recommendations are being examined in consultation with other Departments/agencies.
