Dinesh Singh Commission on riots in Tripura

2140. SHRI NARAYAN KAR: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state;

(a) whether the Central Government had appointed Dinesh Singh Commission to find the causes of riots that took place in Tripura, in June, 1980;

(b) whether the said Commission has submitted its report, if so, when;

(c) what are the salient points of the said report including recommendations, if any; and

(d) what action was taken for the implementation of the recommendations?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF STATES (SHRI GHULAM NABI AZAD): (a) The Government of India had constituted Dinesh Singh Committee in July, 1980 to suggest measures for speedy restoration of normalcy, relief and rehabilitation of the riot victims and to bring about harmonious relations among the different sections of the population in Tripura.

(b) The Committee submitted its Report on 7-8-1980.

(c) and (d) A copy of the Report of Dinesh Singh Committee was laid on the Table of the House on 11th August, 1980. The recommendations were communicated to the State Government and all concerned authorities for necessary action. The Government is alive to the need for accelerated development of Tripura and is taking necessary action in this direction.

Construction of roads along Bangladesh border with Tripura

2141. SHRI NARAYAN KAR: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have any plan to construct roads along the Bangladesh border with Tripura;

(b) whether Government have any plan to post Border Security Force along this border if so, the details thereof;

(c) whether there is a proposal to erect observation posts and barbed wire fence along this border and if so, the details thereof; and

(d) if not, what are the reasons therefor?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF INTERNAL SECURITY (SHRI ARUN NEHRU): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) Border Security Force is already deployed along Bangladesh border with Tripura. Measures for strengthening surveillance along Indo-Bangladesh Border include construction of additional observation post towers. Construction of barbed wire fence along Indo-Bangladesh border will be taken up after construction of border road.

(d) Does not arise.
