one year, 12 Letters of Intent have been issued for setting up of grass root plants for the manufacture of Polyester Filament Yarn for a total capacity of 1,86,000 tonnes/annum.

Licensing policy for synthetic yarn

(a) whether Government have taken a decision to liberalise the licensing policy for synthetic yarn; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof ?

(SHRI M. ARUNACHALAM) :
(a) and (b) With a view to allowing licensed industrial undertakings the flexibility of manufacturing articles according to market demand in cases where this can be done with available common design and production facilities, Government announced in September, 1985, the scheme of broad banding in a number of groups of industries which included the following :—

(i) Synthetic fibre industry covering the three types of fibre namely; Polyester, Nylon and Polypropylene; and

(ii) Synthetic filament yarn including industrial yarn/tyre cord.

In the light of the response of the industry to the above measure, it has been decided to enlarge the scope of the broad banding to permit the manufacturers of the polyester staple fibre to undertake production of polyester filament yarn and *vice versa* by making use of polycondensa-
